These Certificates it will be remarked are to be granted by you only to the Registers of the Land Offices in cases where they are themselves the Purchasers of Lands.⁹⁸

MEMORIAL TO CONGRESS FROM CITIZENS OF THE TERRITORY

[October 22, 1800]

To the Senate and House of Representatives in Congress assembled.

The Memorial of a number of the inhabitants of that tract of Country Situate between the Miami rivers, and North of a tract of land granted by letters patent to John Cleves Symmes and his associates, most respectfully sheweth: That we your memorialists, from many circumstances, had reasonable grounds to believe, that the above named Mr Symmes had contracted with the United States for the lands on which we are setled, and that he would obtain a title for the same, under which impression we became purchasers and many of us paid the purchase money in full, and sundry of us at a period much earlier than his obtaining the letters patent aforesaid. Many of us migrated with our families immediately after the termination of the Indian war under all the disadvantages incident to such a crisis, since that, much of the money remaining after payment for our lands has been expended, and the whole of our labour employed in clearing the wilderness, and making such other improvements as the wants and conveniences of Society require, among which Roads and Mills have been subjects of much labour and expence, for several years we felt secure and laboured with chearfulness, nor was it until June one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine that we were fully convinced that Mr Symmes' claim was held as a nullity, when the Act of Congress reached us granting the right of pre-emption to purchasers of certain descriptions. Our situation a year ago induced us to forward an address to your Honourable body by the Gentleman delegated to Represent the Territory in Congress, as we have not obtained the

relief we prayed for in that yet we do not give over suit, but firmly relying in the equity and Bounty of Congress trust that our case will be taken into consideration early in the ensuing Session, and that the question will be determined whether we can apply without further waste of time to M^r Symmes for our titles or a reimbursement of our monies. Should M^r Symmes not obtain a patent we trust that all of us who hold under his claim, until one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine will obtain a pre-emption right upon the same terms on which M^r Symmes might have held the same had he complied with the terms of his original contract. Our lands we purchased agreeable to a partial survey which had been made of the tract, the meridional lines being run only and each miles end monumented which was designed to supply the place of East and West lines being run by M^r Symmes, each holder of a section holding by an immaginary line from one monument to its correspondent one on its adjacent meridian now should a resurvey be made it is probable that a considerable variation will happen in the lines, therefore we trust that this subject will merit the attention of Congress, and such provisions be made as will quiet us in the possession of the land we actually purchased. independant of whatever alteration be may be occasioned by a resurvey.⁹⁹ The foregoing is the situation of your memorialists, to whom your Honourable body will extend such relief as the merits of their case may require, and they shall &c.

RUFUS PUTNAM TO THE SECRETARY OF THE TREASURY [GLO: Div. E, Ohio SG, vol. 64, 1797-1804:LS]

MARIETTA January 10th 1801

SIR I have forwarded to the Auditor of the Treasury Department, my account closed to the 31st day of December 1800 in which I have charged for an additional Clerk for the last three months at the rate of 450 dollars per year, he has been almost wholly employ'd in the service of the United States for eighteen months past,¹⁰ but I did not conceive your letter of the eighth of October,¹¹ warranted my charging for more than the last quarter of the year—

since my last information on the subject I have drawn the following Orders on the Treasurer—

Notwithstanding Congress omitted the last Session to appropriate money for the purpose, yet the additional Surveys authorized by the Act of the 10th of May last, will be so far advanced, before the vendues commence in the Spring as to prevent any delay in the sales— I enclose you the copies of six contracts, entered into, in pursuance of the aforesaid Act¹²—in all of which except one, you'll perceive that the Deputy Surveyor's expectations of payment rest on the appropriation of money being made for that purpose, the present session of Congress—as soon as I am informed, that money is appropriated to defray the expence¹³—I shall enter into contracts for completing all the surveys authoriz'd by Iaw—
